



## Rabbits Class

Rabbits class have been enjoying the story of Beegu – a little alien that is lost and scared on planet earth. The children received a letter from Beegu and had to make a response. ## Hedgehogs Class

Hedgehogs have been learning about the phases of the moon as part of their topic 'Why Leave Earth?' They have taken their own 'giant leap' by learning about Neil Armstrong and the lunar landing. On top of that, the children have been learning to edit their work and have learnt that it's not easy to spot your own mistakes.

## Foxes Class

Our FOSS team has continued to work tirelessly in supporting the school. We have enjoyed some really special community events that have also raised some much needed funds for the school. The FOSS team has recently been struck with Covid but has continued to plan behind the scenes and is gearing up for the Easter Fair on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> April. The first part of their plans is to hold a non-uniform day this Friday (25<sup>th</sup> March) where children are asked to bring in an Easter themed chocolate donation that will help towards the Easter raffle.

### FOSS events:

- Our Valentine cake sales (held over two days in February) raised £191.72. Thank you so much for your generous donations and for purchasing these tasty treats.
- Smarties tube 20p Challenge: Congratulations to Rabbits class who raised a staggering £74.20 and will be busy planning their very own non-school-uniform day. All classes responded well to the challenge, which generated £181.95! Thank you children and parents. Lego prizes were awarded to Aurora, Erin and Mason for the creating the best-decorated Smartie tubes.



- The Scholastic Book fair, which enabled parents to purchase some of the latest book titles at competitive prices, was enjoyed by the entire school. I am pleased to share that sales eclipsed £400 which means that Stedham school will receive £171.49 to spend on new books.
- Sadly, our 'Movie Night' planned to take place on the 18<sup>th</sup> March had to be postponed due to sickness throughout our FOSS team. We will provide a new date in the near future.
- Easter Fair on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> April. More details to be shared nearer the time.

## Further school news/updates:

**YEAR 6 PREPARATION FOR SATS:** The efforts to do all we can in readiness for the SATs in May continue. With less than 5 school weeks before the children actually sit their tests, we remind children to continue to use their CGP SATs Study guide and workbook.

We intend to set some Easter homework for the year 6 children to help with their on-going preparation. This homework project is called '10 for 10', which suggests that the children do '10 minutes homework for 10 days'. This 'little but often' approach helps keep the children focused on areas they need to develop without having a big impact on the holidays. The children will receive this for maths and GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling).

**READING AT STEDHAM:** Following Mr Noble's reading presentation two weeks ago, we wish to remind parents about the school's strong desire that all children read regularly (ideally at least four times a week). We want our children to develop a love for reading so that they can enjoy the pleasure that books can bring. Children that are confident readers make increased progress in all subject areas and are better prepared for secondary school.

**STAFF UPDATES:** After a long illness, Jane Hines has decided to terminate her contract and further her career elsewhere. We wish her well and will be looking to recruit a permanent teacher for the start of next academic year.

**GILLIAN KEEGAN'S VISIT:** Sadly, we had to cancel Gillian's visit to the school on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> due to staff sickness but we have rescheduled her visit and look forward to her coming to Stedham on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> May.

**BREAKFAST CLUB/AFTER SCHOOL CLUB UPDATES:** SportsCool, who provided our wrap around care provision with both breakfast and after school clubs will not be continuing their provision. This, we appreciate, will make things complicated for some families. For the remainder of the term, the school will provide a breakfast club provision from 8am.

**MINIBUS TRAINING:** To enable more enrichment opportunities (sports events, trips and residential), Mr Noble and myself have just taken tests that allow us to drive minibuses. Although we do not have our own minibuses, we can hire them from other local primary schools. This will significantly reduce the cost of trips for parents/carers, as the coach hire is always the most expensive cost when planning a trip.

**YEAR 6 RESIDENTIAL:** We have set dates and begun plans for Foxes residential this year. The year 5 and 6 pupils will enjoy a three night camp experience at Stedham Campsite from Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> until Friday 17<sup>th</sup> June. We are planning to include a variety of fun activities on and off site and hope that this will be a memorable and special trip for all pupils. We are conscious of the cost to parents and will make every effort to keep the expense to a minimum. We will provide further details in the near future.
