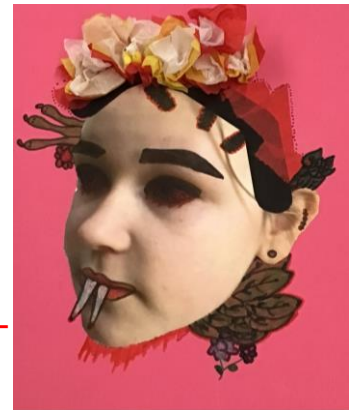
best of all, in art, we've been re-creating ourselves into Greek gods and goddesses!

Louisa looked at many of the gods and goddesses, but particularly based her design on serpent-headed Medussa.

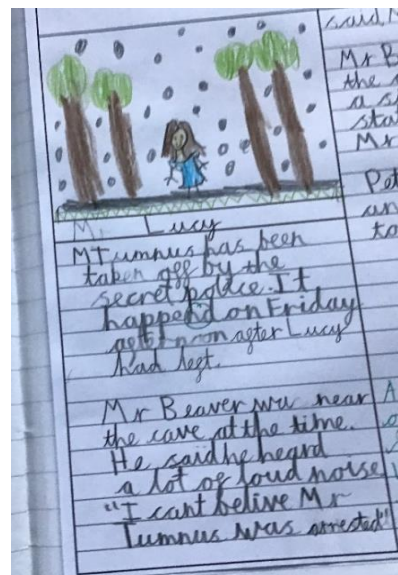


Happy Hedgehogs

"I'm so proud of myself as I learned to use joined-up handwriting this term!" Scarlet explained.

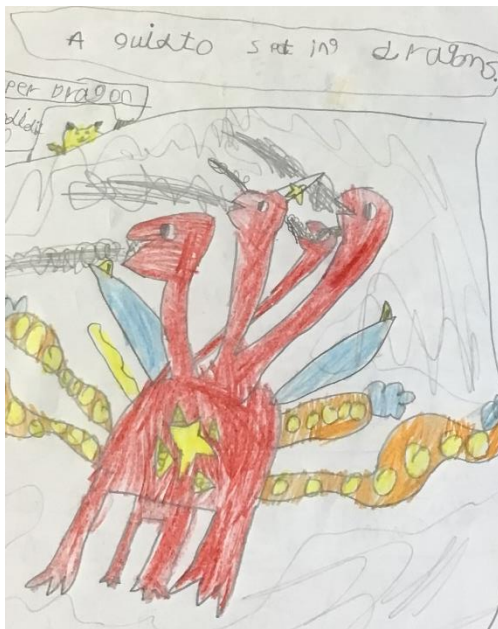
Finally, there was a special message from Hedgehogs teacher, Mrs Sates.

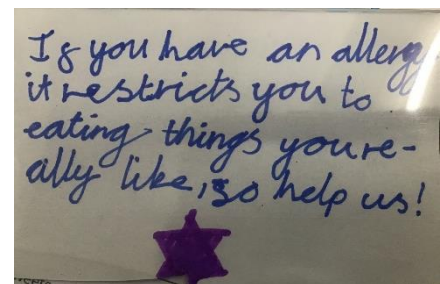
