

Over the course of the next few weeks, we will visit a number of fairy tales and identify the overriding theme that good will always overcome evil. Children will be writing their very own version of a fairytale, using a rich variety of vocabulary, and composing written work that is well structured and imaginative.

Our focus on reading continues this term and parents are encouraged to listen to reading daily so as to develop fluency and a love of reading. We are hoping to hand out Reading Rocket certificates on a weekly basis.

In History, we are looking at Ancient Egypt and the importance of the River Nile. We will discover how an important and powerful civilization depended on the annual flooding of the river enabled it to flourish. This is a very special year in which Queen Elizabeth II celebrates her platinum jubilee on the throne. We will look at British history and how she came to ascend the throne. We are planning some unique and fun activities to celebrate this special event in history.

Our focus in Geography is on Human Geography, looking at the different types of settlements and land use, economic activity and trade routes as well as the distribution of natural resources that include energy, food, minerals and water.

In DT, we will be working with the children across the school to help design and build the best house for one of the three little pigs to live in.
