DfE encourages schools to use this template as an effective way of meeting the reporting requirements of the Primary PE and Sport Premium.

Under the Ofsted Schools Inspection Framework, inspectors will assess how effectively leaders use the Primary PE and Sport Premium and measure its impact on outcomes for pupils, and how effectively governors hold them to account for this.
